Kearns Honors Veterans

Veteran's Day takes place on Friday, November 10th this year and Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns unveiled the newest reserved parking space for Purple Heart Combat Wounded Veterans at the Erie County Auto Bureau. This reserved space is immediately adjacent to existing handicapped parking spots. This is the seventh such spot for Purple Heart recipients Kearns has se-

cured in Erie County. "With Veterans Day approaching on November 11th, I am hon-ored to dedicate this specially reserved parking spot in our ongoing effort to salute service members wounded in combat. It serves as a reminder that we have residents throughout Erie County that have bravely served our nation, made sacrifices for us, and were bestowed the Purple Heart," said Erie County Clerk Kearns.

Know Your Risks Of Lead Poisoning

The Erie County Department of Health (EC-DOH) and Live Well Erie have these messages for anyone with a young child in their home: know your risks of lead poisoning and get children

tested for lead at age one year and age two years. "Lead poison-

ing prevention starts with awareness," said Commissioner of Health Dr.

Gale Burstein. "Most parents and caregivers take great care to remove dangers in their home that could injure their child, taking actions like installing baby gates at the top of staircases and using safety plugs in electrical outlets. But lead paint is an invisible hazard that is present in many homes, and it can cause developmental delays, learning disabilities, hearing loss and

hearing loss and behavioral disorders that last a lifetime."

National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week (NLPPW) runs from October 22-28, and has the backing of federal agencies like the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Locally, EC-DOH, Live Well Erie and the Buffalo and Erie County Lead Safe Task Force through the Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo also endorse all efforts to give families the facts about lead poisoning, encourage them to get their children's blood lead levels tested, and for all residents to know their risk.

"The health and well-being of children and working families are central to our Live Well Erie initiative," said Deputy County Executive Lisa Chimera. "Lead poisoning can be so devastating to a child, in ways *Continued on page five.*

Frosts And Freezes, Snow And Sleet On The Way

Continued from page one would eat, water sources for drinking, hygiene and cleaning, and ways to stay warm should be at the top of the list. As you put those items into a box, bag, or easy-to-reach shelf, consider making another minikit to keep in your vehicle. The Erie County Office of Health Equity has a newsletter, Let's Get Ready for Winter, at www.erie.gov/ health-equity, with extensive recommendations.

The Ready.gov web site also has detailed instructions and lists of what to keep in your emergency kit. Prepare your Space

Prepare your Space Beyond basic tools like a sturdy snow shovel and ice scraper for your vehicle, think about your house or apartment's power and water systems. Do you have pipes that could freeze? Do you know where your electric fuse box is? If you have a generator, is it in good working order, and do you have fuel for it? Take time now to insulate water pipes and know the basics of how your utilities work. Check your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and make sure you have appropriate fire extinguishers in your kitchen and other parts of your home.

Within your household, think about any specific medical or mobility needs for you and any pets or livestock. Take time now to talk to your doctor about alternatives if winter weather disrupts your ability to get prescription medications or to travel to life-saving treatments like dialysis. For people who rely on oxygen, what is your plan if the power goes out or if your supply runs low? Ask these questions now, before the snow starts to fly.

Build your Circle of Care Talk to family members, friends and neighbors about how you could approach winter weather emergencies together – what resources and skills you need, and what gaps you need to fill. Trainings like stop the bleed, basic first aid, hands-only CPR and winter preparedness give you skills to be the help until help arrives.

You can connect with others to stay safe and comfortable if the power goes out and roads are unsafe. Deputy County Executive Lisa Chimera and Live Well Erie shared a video on this topic; watch at https:// bit.ly/ECCircleOfCare.

Stay Aware and Informed


Before, during and after a winter weather emergency, Erie County will share important updates on its web site, social media, through local media and through the ReadyErie app. Download it for free for Android and Apple devices at erie.gov/readyerie.

Have an alternative way, like a battery-operated radio, to hear weather updates in case your power or internet service is interrupted. And make a habit of checking the weather forecast frequently, especially if you have travel planned. Our National Weather Service – Buffalo office partners are the definitive source for weather conditions and forecasts. 

Ask Rusty - When Should I Retire And **Claim My Social Security Benefits?**

Dear Rusty: I am 64 years old and having difficulty working due to my arthritis, but I can continue part time as a podiatrist. I do not know the best way to determine when to retire. What is the formula or a way to determine which is a better choice? Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advi-sor. Signed: Undecided

Undecided: Dear There is a difference between deciding when to retire from working and deciding when to claim your Social Security benefits. For the former, you should consult with a certified financial advisor, but I'll provide you with how Social Security fits into your personal circumstances. In deciding when to claim Social Security, you should look at your financial needs, your life expectancy, your work status, and your marital status. There is no one formula right for everyone because everyone's circumstances are different, but here are some things to help decide what is right for you:

Social Security has an "earnings test" which applies to anyone who collects Social Security before reaching their full retirement age (FRA). Your FRA is 66 years and 8 months, and that is the point at which you get 100% of the SS benefit earned from a lifetime of working. If you collect SS before your FRA

and continue to work, there is a limit to how much you can earn without jeopardizing your benefits. For example, the earnings limit for 2023 is \$21,240 and, if that is exceeded, SS will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. They "take away" benefits by withholding future payments until they recover the penalty for exceeding the limit. If your earnings are substantially over the limit, you will be ineligible to collect Social Security until either your earnings are less, or you reach your FRA.

If you claim SS before your FRA your benefit amount will be permanentwill be about 89% of what granted annually.

ly reduced. If, for example, you claim SS to start at age 65 your monthly benefit

it would be at your FRA. That reduced benefit would not change thereafter except for Cost of Living Ad-justments (COLA) usually

If Social Security will be a major part of your retirement income, then waiting to get a higher monthly benefit may be a prudent strategy for you. The longer you wait to claim the more your benefit will be. Your SS benefit will continue to grow until you are 70 years old, and at 70 your month-ly benefit will be about 27% more than it would be at your FRA. Your maximum SS benefit will be attained

Life expectancy is a very important factor in deciding when to claim SS. If you claim at age 70 instead of at your FRA, you will need to live until you are about 83 to breakeven moneywise. If you live even longer than that, then waiting until 70 will yield the highest monthly amount and the most in cumulative lifetime benefits. But if your anticipated life expectancy is less, claiming earlier may be a better choice.

If you are married and expect your wife to survive you, consider that the benefit your wife can get as your widow will be based on your SS benefit when you die, thus the longer you wait to claim the more your wife's benefit as your widow may be. If you predecease your wife, her benefit will be based on the amount you were receiving at your death if that is more than her personally

earned SS benefit.

So, as you can see, deciding when to claim Social Security Is a decision to be made after carefully evaluating your personal circumstances as described above. Continued from page one that put limits on their future. We are confident in the work being done to identify and eliminate lead exposure and risks in our county, and to give all kids a chance to succeed."

Get Your Child Tested There is no safe blood lead level in children. Lead is a neurotoxin that damages the brain. Even low levels of lead exposure can cause serious and lifelong health impacts. Children should get tested for lead at age one and age two years, and as recommended by their pediatri-

cian. When a child has a high blood lead level, other children in the household should also be tested.

ECDOH public health nurses provide case man-agement in coordination with the family's primary care provider for all lead poisoned children, while sanitarians conduct investigations and provides information to parents of children under age 18 years old that have tested positive for elevated blood lead levels. This is one of several county resources for lead poisoning prevention.
